West Caldwell, New Jersey is home to the Machine Tool division and Cleveland, Waco is home to the Lift truck division. The U.S. headquarters in Georgia facilitates a first rate parts operation capable of supplying an excess of 25,000 line items to support Lift Truck, Compact Equipment, Machine Tool and Construction client desires.

With a network consisting of over 90 autonomous dealers, the forklift group provides quality materials handling equipment to the wide-ranging North American marketplace. Doosan Infracore America Forklift sellers successfully operate in over 220 service and sales locations all through Canada and the U.S. The lift truck product line remarkably features 63 different models consisting of 82 various battery and engine configurations of Electric-powered and Internal Combustion vehicles. Capacities of these numerous truck models range from 3,000 to 33,000 lbs. All vehicles are designed in an ISO 9001 certified facility.

Doosan Infracore America is the fastest growing forklift business in the North American marketplace, due to their consistency in maintaining a high level of consumer service excellence and optimum product functioning to all Doosan Infracore Lift Truck users. The U.S. lift Truck division stationed in Cleveland has a professional team knowledgeable in Product Sales, Purchasing, Marketing, Logistical and Technical Support.

Initially the home-based lift truck market in Korea was an open import enterprise. Korea Machinery Co. Ltd. began in 1960, to import fully assembled lift trucks as part of a domestic equipment expansion project. Sales of these products were initially targeted to state-run companies, large scale organizations, and the military. This ultimately led to a merger with Daewoo Heavy Industries Ltd. In 1976, the Forklift Division begun trade operations throughout Korea to overhaul and sell this heavy equipment. By 1978, a lift truck production plant was successfully completed. Continuous technical training became the new focus for improving quality and product development.

Daewoo started the first home-based forklift business in 1967, and rapidly acquired a massive 90% share in the Korean Materials Handling market. By the 1980's, Daewoo's superior technological advancements combined with sales success placed them in a situation of substantial growth of their lift truck operations.

In 1981, Caterpillar Industrial Inc. of the United States, proposed a cooperative venture project to counter act competitive pressures in the US materials handling market. This project radically expanded Daewoo's forklift sales. Construction was finished in 1984 to facilitate a contemporary plant which helped establish the company for the fabrication of high added-value products suitable for export. In 1993, the corporation had a global sales system and started exporting models they had developed through in-house expertise, as an independent brand. Certifications were then acquired from CE of Europe, UL of the United States and ISO 14001 and ISO 9001, securing expansion opportunities into overseas markets.
